## NELSON MANDELA: A LAWYER, REVOLUTIONARY AND STATESMAN



In 1931, South Africa declared independence from British authority. Only when National Party came to power in 1948, racial discrimination was reinforced, and racial segregation had become a core strategy. This subsequently became a source of contention with other countries, and South Africa was blacklisted in trade, global projects, and sporting events due to its actions and policies. Mandela was a prominent player in the campaign against South Africa's repressive and rigid racial rule apartheid policies for more than 40 years, 27 of them in imprisonment.

Before working as a lawyer in Johannesburg, he enrolled at the University of Fort Hare and the University of Witwatersrand. He got involved in anti-colonial and African ideologies there, later joined the ANC and co-founding the Youth League in 1944. Mandela and the ANC vowed to remove racism, a policy of segregation

and discrimination that favored whites, when the National Party's white-only government created it. He was elected president of the ANC's Transvaal section, and he came to fame through his participation in the 1952 Defiance Campaign and the 1955 Congress of the Individuals.

He was imprisoned several times for seditious actions and was subsequently convicted in the Treason Trial in 1956. Marxism inspired him, and he covertly entered the illegal South African Communist Party (SACP). Although dedicated to peaceful protests, he co-founded the militant in 1961 alongside the SACP and conducted demolition operations against the government. In 1962, he was arrested and detained, and after the Rivonia Trial, he was given a life sentence for attempting to undermine the state.

Mandela was jailed on Robben Island in 1964, and then transferred to Polls moor and Victor Verser Prisons before being released in 1990. He shared the Nobel Peace Prize with FW de Klerk in 1993, and he became South Africa's first democratically elected Government in 1994. After

retiring from political affairs in 1999, he established the Nelson Mandela Foundation and began working to raise attention to issues such as HIV and AIDS.

He has traveled extensively after his release from jail, whereupon he testified. "The biography of Pandit Nehru enabled me ready for my release," Nelson Mandela asserts. Who talked over what happens once you come out of prison. Mandela received the Nobel Peace Prize in memory of those who campaigned for harmony and against discrimination. He has received the majority of recognition as the ANC and all South Africans.

Every year, we commemorate Nelson Mandela International Day to honor a hero who altered the 20th century and shaped the twenty-first. It is an opportunity for everyone to reaffirm their commitment to the principles that motivated Nelson Mandela. Unwavering resolve. A strong devotion to fairness, individual rights, and basic liberties. A person who believes in the rights and dignity of all men and women. With the never commitment to discussion and unity throughout all borders and conflicts. Nelson Mandela was a remarkable politician, a staunch defender for justice, and the national leader of South African reconciliation.

The United Nations specifically registered Mandela Day in 2009 with a statement in the General Assembly, and the inaugural UN Mandela Day was commemorated on July 18, 2010. The day does not intended to be a national holiday, but instead to honor Nelson Mandela's work life with giving and volunteer activities.

Nelson Mandela was born on July 18, 1918, in the community of Mvezo, Umtata, South Africa's Cape Region. Carrying the surname Rolihlahla, which translates as "troublemaker," he was later recognized by his nickname, Madiba. His paternal grandfather ruled the contemporary Eastern Cape region of Southern Africa. Nelson Mandela had been sent to Healdton, a reputable Wesleyan secondary school, after completing his elementary school education at a nearby mission school. He then enrolled in the Bachelor of Arts program at Fort Hare University College, where he had been elected to the Student Representative Council. He was also expelled for participating in a college political strike.





# DROUPADI MURMU VS. YASHWANT SINHA: INDIA'S 15TH PRESIDENT WILL BE ELECTED ON MONDAY, JULY 18TH

On 18th July, India will elect its 15th President, with NDA nominee Droupadi Murmu holding a strong lead over opposition candidate Yashwant Sinha, with over 60% of votes predicted to be cast in her favour. On Monday, over 4,800 elected MPs and MLAs will vote. The voting will take place between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. in Parliament House and state legislative assemblies, for which ballot boxes have already been delivered. On July 21, the votes will be counted in Parliament House, and the future President will take the oath of office on July 25. President Ram Nath Kovind's tenure ends on July 24.

## MURMU IS UNQUESTIONABLY THE FAVOURITE

Murmu's vote share is expected to reach about two-thirds with the backing of regional parties such as the BJD, YSRCP, BSP, AIADMK, TDP, JD(S), Shiromani Akali Dal, Shiv Sena, and now JMM. She would become the first woman from the tribal group to hold the highest constitutional seat. After the backing of different regional parties, the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) nominee currently has over 6.67 lakh votes out of a total of 10,86,431 votes. Murmu, a relatively obscure person in national politics, served as a minister in the Odisha government from March 2000 until May 2004 during the BJP-BJD coalition's administration. She is a Santhal tribal by origin and was elected MLA from Odisha's Rairangpur assembly seat on a BJP ticket in 2000 and 2004.

Murmu's win will include multiple firsts. She will be the first President of Independent India to be born. Murmu, 64, will be the youngest occupant of Rashtrapati Bhavan, as well as the first tribal leader to hold the country's highest position.

## THE OPPOSITION FUMBLES AND THEN SELECTS SINHA



Before choosing Sinha, a former Union minister and BJP leader, the opposition camp sought Gopalkrishna Gandhi, Mahatma Gandhi's grandson and former West Bengal governor, NCP head Sharad Pawar, and National Conference leader Farooq Abdullah to fight the election. Following their refusal to participate in the election, Sinha, then the vice president of the Trinamool Congress, was designated the Opposition's candidate. The Congress, NCP, Trinamool Congress, Communist Party of India, Communist Party of India (Marxist), Akhilesh Yadav's Samajwadi Party, National Conference, All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM), Rashtriya Janata Dal, and All India United Democratic Front support Sinha (AIUDF).

The Arvind Kejriwal-led Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) recently announced its support for Sinha's candidacy. Sinha, for his part, has been quite active in attempting to rally opposition parties and members to support his candidacy. To help rescue the Constitution, democracy, secularism, and India, the former BJP leader has made ardent pleas to lawmakers and legislators throughout the country to vote for him regardless of party allegiance. "This election is your final chance to offer much-needed course correction in the BJP," he told BJP legislators.

Sinha, who launched his campaign from Kerala on June 28, claimed he concluded it on July 16 with a visit to his native state of Jharkhand. During this time, he stated he visited 13 state capitals, including Thiruvananthapuram, Chennai, Raipur, Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Gandhinagar, Srinagar, Chandigarh, Jaipur, Guwahati, Bhopal, Patna, and Ranchi, and gave 50 interviews.

On the day of the presidential election, Sinha attacks his NDA opponent, claiming that if won, Murmu will become a "quiet, pliant, rubber-stamp Rashtrapati." Murmu, according to RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav, is a statue. "We do not want a statue to be placed within the Rashtrapati Bhavan. Have any of you ever heard Murmu's voice? She hasn't even had a news conference since her name was revealed. At the very least, we've all heard of Yashwant Sinha and have a sense of what he stands for." According to the former Bihar deputy chief minister.

## COLLEGE OF VOTERS

The electoral college, which elects the President using a proportional representation system, is made up of elected MPs and members of state legislative assemblies. Members of legislative councils, as well as nominated MPs and MLAs, are not eligible to vote in

this election. The secret ballot method is used, and parties cannot issue voting whips to their MPs and MLAs.

## THE WORTH OF A VOTE

Due to the absence of a legislative assembly in Jammu and Kashmir, the value of a member of Parliament's vote has decreased from 708 to 700 in this presidential election. The importance of an MLA's vote varies per state. The worth of each MLA's vote in Uttar Pradesh is 208, followed by 176 in Jharkhand and Tamil Nadu. It is 175 in Maharashtra. Sikkim has a vote value of seven per MLA, whereas Nagaland has a vote value of nine and Mizoram has a vote value of eight.

## PROCEDURE FOR ELECTION

The President is elected using a single transferable vote in line with the proportional representation system. Every voter may mark as many choices as there are candidates running for office. The elector's preferences for the candidates are to be marked by inserting the figures 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and so on, in the order of choice, beside the names of the candidates in the space provided in column 2 of the ballot paper. This is why electronic voting machines are not utilised in this election, as well as vice presidential, Rajya Sabha, and legislative council elections. The EVMS are based on a technology that allows them to aggregate votes in direct elections such as the Lok Sabha and state legislatures.

According to the Election Commission, whereas MPs will receive a green ballot paper, MLAs will receive a pink ballot paper to vote on. Separate colours assist the returning officer in determining the value of each MLA and MP's vote. In order to guarantee voting confidentiality, the EC has supplied a specially developed pen with violet ink to allow voters to mark their ballot papers in the presidential election.

## BIRTH OF SWAMIJI

It is natural in the mind of every mother that her child should brighten the fame of the family. First two children had died in infancy, that is why Mother Bhuvaneshwari Devi would pray to Shiva every day that 'O Shiva! Give me a son like you.' By telling a familiar person residing in Kashi, he had also got Veereshwar Shiva worshiped for a year.

Mata Bhuvneshwari's mind and heart used to pray by remembering Lord Shankar continuously. One night, in a dream, she also saw Mahadevji sitting in his lap in the form of a child. After waking up he said 'Jai Shankar, Jai Bholenath!' Saying this she started praying.

After a few months she gave birth to a son. The day of 12th January, 1863 and on the holy festival like Makar Sankranti, the mother gave the name 'Vireshwar' to the son who was received by the grace of Mahadevji. But everyone used to call him 'Bile' in love. After some time, he was named 'Narendranath'. And later this Narendranath became Famous all over the world by the name of Swami Vivekananda.

became India's first female engineer. Her role at Telco was critical in altering the industry's employment standards.

It would be unjust not to discuss N.R Narayan Murthy alongside Sudha Murthy. Narayan Murthy and Sudha Murthy are two faces of the same coin. Both are diametrically opposed, yet compatible and



supplemental to one another. Sudha Murthy was confident, outgoing, and enthusiastic, but Narayan Murthy was reserved and introverted. Sudha Murthy refers about herself as Narayan Murthy's "support system." Narayan Murthy and Sudha Murthy became involved in a wedding celebration in 1978. The actual budget of the wedding ceremony is Rs800, which itself was equally distributed across both households.

It would not be inaccurate to say that Sudha Murthy is the MOTHER of Infosys. She has raised and nourished the organization like a parent. Sudha has given up her joys. She committed her efforts, which resulted in threefold profit on the name Infosys. Sudha Murthy has done it all for her child unconditionally, just as a mother would.

though. Sudha Murthy gave him her entire funds of Rs ten thousand to pursue his goals, which she had saved and proved to be Narayan Murthy's most steadfast supporter. Sudha Murthy wishes to see women empowered. She pays personal visits to the poor to become conversant with their true situation. Her programs cover a wide range of topics, including economic development, healthcare, schooling, and sanitation facilities. Sudha Murthy has always been interested in mainstreaming gender. She has been involved with the Gates Foundation for many years. She has established numerous orphanages and schools, all of which have computer labs and library resources. ## KARNATAKA'S STANCE PAPER FOR SCHOOL TEXTBOOK CHAPTERS ON HINDU KINGDOMS AND AYURVEDA

**K**arnataka's position paper on National Education Policy (NEP) - 2020, titled 'Knowledge of India,' proposes chapters in textbooks on Hindu kingdoms, Ayurveda, women who fought for freedom and foreign invaders, genocides of Hindus, and the concept of 27 'nakshatras' to track the position of the Moon, among other topics, in an effort to impart 'Bharatiya' knowledge.

The article also vehemently opposes the translation of Indian names into Roman and English while recommending school curricula that follow to the "Bharatiya dharma parampara." "It is advised that if Indic terminology must be used, they be utilised without being translated into English." For example, it is normal practise to substitute 'dharma' with 'religion,' according to the study.

The paper emphasises the lack of coverage of the 'genocide' of Malabar Hindus, Maharashtrian Brahmins, and Kashmiri Hindus in textbooks, which it claims are written from the perspective of the invaders and colonisers. It also includes chapters on historical heroines such as Queen Rudramadevi, Ri Abbakka Chaut, Keadhi Chennamma, Ahilya Bai Holkar, Belawadi Mallamma, and Onake Obavva.

The paper also emphasises the importance of devoting more room to chapters on Hindu kingdoms like as the Marathas, Cholas, Kasmira dynasty, Kalingas, and Gangas, while emphasising that education policies in the "garb of secularism" have disregarded the achievements of "our forefathers." It strongly advises teaching the 'philosophy of Ayurveda' in schools, alongside the Siddha and Unani systems of medicine. Some of the themes covered in this course include: yurvedic perspectives, daily and seasonal regimens, natural desire suppression, pregnant and postnatal care, and so on.

The position paper also attempts to

"cut down the Eurocentric notions" of science, history, and mathematics in order to emphasise ancient India's contributions in these domains. The paper suggests incorporating economic themes from books such as Arthastra, Mahbharta (ntiparva), Rmyaa (Kaccit-sarga), and others. "In civics, chosen ideas from Arthastra's Adhyakapraca and Dharmasthiya may be introduced in this course; in biology, Paca mahbhta, tridoa theory, embryo development, six rasa-based classification of food, notion of illness, and so on can be added," the document states.

Madan Gopal, the head of Karnataka's NEP task group, defended the position paper, calling it a "introduction to interdisciplinary education based on an Indic-driven approach." "The notion of using 27 nakshatras to follow the location of the Moon and other celestial body claims is based on Indian astronomy." The movement of the planets and the solar system calculated by Indian astronomers is significantly more precise than the Roman calendar. Furthermore, these position papers are only suggestions. Two further position papers are now being peer reviewed."

In a statement, the All India Save Education Committee (AISEC), created by a group of activists, accused the BJP (government) of "instilling Hindu pride and fostering a jingoistic psyche." "It appears that this position paper unfairly attaches fake and contrived myths to Vedic literature and diminishes ancient India's true contributions." "The government-prepared paper says that Vedic literature contain all global knowledge," stated Mahesh SG, AISEC Secretary for Karnataka.

## 'MEET ANIL SHAH' OF MUMBAI HAS TOPPED THE ICAI CA FINAL MAY 2022



**M**eeet Anil Shah of Mumbai clinched the CA final exam this year with 80.25 percent, followed by Akshat Goyal of Jaipur in second place with 79.88 percent and Shrushtu Keyurbhai Sanghavi in third place with 76.38 percent. This year, 1,18,771 candidates were admitted to the Final test, which was held in 489 locations around the nation. And 66575 applicants took the Group 1 exam, with 14643 (21.99%) passing. Similarly, 13877 (21.94%) passed the Group 2 exam, with 63253 passing, and 3695 passing the Group 3 exam, with 29348 candidates taking the exam this year. 12449 candidates qualified as Chartered Accountants in total.

From May 14 to 30, the ICAI CA final examinations for the May session were held. The exams were administered by the ICAI in 192 districts, and all Covid-19 protocols were observed in the exam halls. Meanwhile, the Chartered Accountants Foundation exams, which had been postponed in the Silchar (Assam) examination venue, have been rescheduled for July 14-16, 2022.

## NEW LABOR CODE



**T**he central government wants to execute a new labor code for the employed individuals.

The draft has been sent by center to all the state government. The central government desires four labor codes to be executed earliest. As per the information, maximum states have given their comment on this draft. Union Labor Minister Bhupendra Yadav on the Labor Code, said that almost all the states have set the draft rules on the four labor codes. Now the central government is making and efforts to implement it within the time frame and the employees can get the advantage of it.

### Labor Code will be executed shortly

Central government is expecting that execution can be done in executed short time as mostly state have already made their draft regarding the Labor Code. While giving information, Union Minister Bhupendra Yadav said that Rajasthan has made the draft guidelines on two codes, while in West Bengal, Mausada is in the closing stages. Few states of the Northeast, such as Meghalaya, have not yet finalized the process.

### Changes in Wages to office timings

After the enactment of the new labor code, there will be a modification in the rulebooks from your remuneration to provident fund deposits, from office hours to superannuation. There can be changes in several rules like leaves, full and final settlement on leaving the job. It is held that the new labor code will modify overtime rules after working hours and the half-hour break. In the new-fangled labor code, working more than 48 hours in a week will be treated as overtime. Overtime will have to be paid by the company.

After the implementation of the new labor code, there may be a change in the salary structure the basic salary will be up to 50 percent. The other part of the salary will be allotted in the remaining 50 percent. Though, this regulation will decrease your take home salary. Your PF contribution will rise only if the basic salary increases. This is because the PF contribution is based on the basic salary and the contribution will rise as the basic salary increases. In addition to PF, there will also be an increase in gratuity.

## NASSCOM COLLABORATES WITH GOOGLE ON DIGIVAANI CALL CENTER TO ASSIST WOMEN FARMERS

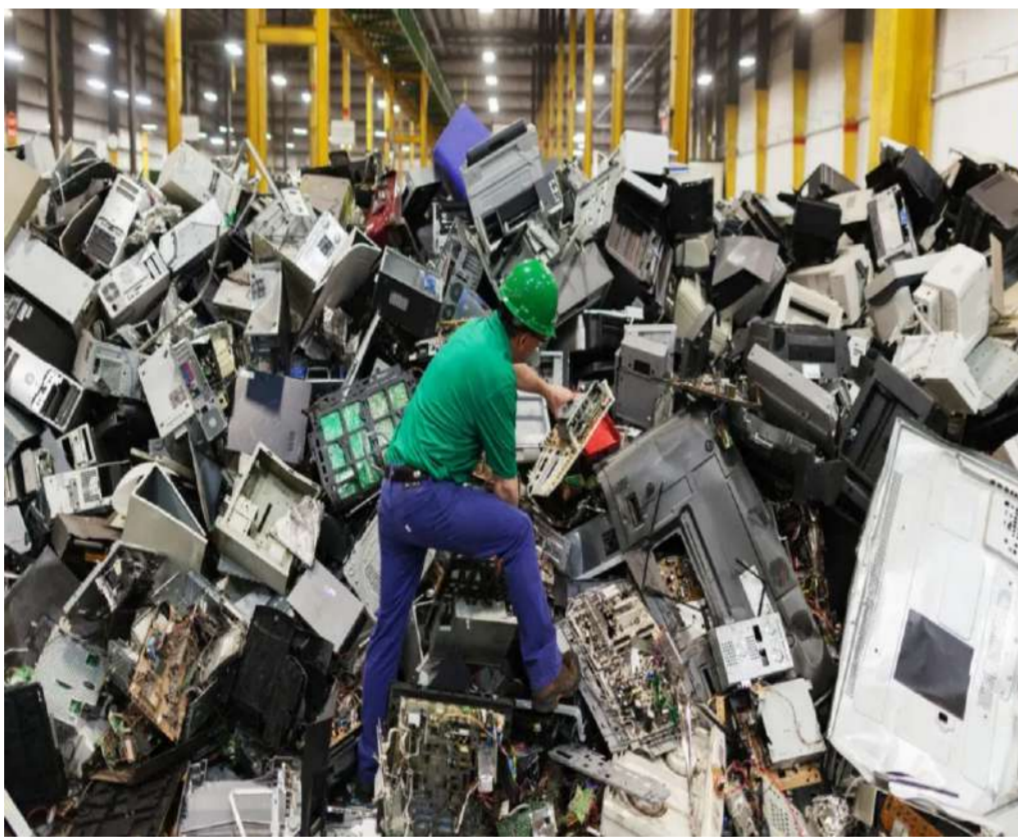

The "DigiVaani Call Center" initiative is being piloted, with the goal of initially covering 20,000 rural women entrepreneurs across six states: Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Haryana, and Rajasthan. ISAP's

Delhi and Lucknow offices now have a DigiVaani call centre. Google.org, Google's philanthropy arm, is funding the initiative. DigiVaani will be a site where rural women entrepreneurs may contact and acquire information about various programmes that can help them build up their businesses, whether they are government schemes or any other information that might aid them.

## HOLAMBI KALAN NEAR DELHI WILL BE HOME TO INDIA'S FIRST E-WASTE ECO PARK

According to an official release, Delhi Environment Minister Gopal Rai met with officials from the Environment Department and the Delhi Pollution Control Committee to discuss the creation of an e-waste eco park. Rai stated that India's first e-waste eco park will be built on around 21 acres in Holambi Kalan, Delhi. He stated that an 11-member steering committee has been constituted, and that the Delhi State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation (DSIIDC) has been designated as the implementing agency. "The competent agency has been directed to hire a consultant as soon as possible in order to accelerate the development of the eco park."



"The park will be finished in around 23 months," Rai stated. Every year, Delhi generates over two lakh tonnes of e-waste, accounting for around 9.5% of total e-waste produced in India, with just 5% adequately recycled. "By 'e-waste eco park,' we mean the creation of a location where this e-waste is deconstructed, reconditioned, repurposed, and created in a scientifically and environmentally sound manner," the minister stated. He stated that the decision was made in view of the fact that Delhi is India's fifth-largest producer of e-waste, trailing only Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, and West Bengal.

## 'PIVOT,' AN AI-BASED TOOL, HAS BEEN DEVELOPED TO DETECT CANCER-CAUSING GENES IN PATIENTS, BY RESEARCHERS FROM IIT MADRAS



According to the World Health Organization (WHO), cancer is the leading cause of death worldwide. Cancer was responsible for around one in every six fatalities in 2020. Traditional techniques often employ algorithms that predict driver genes by examining numerous samples from the same cancer type to discover genes that are responsible for tumour growth in that cancer type. These approaches do not identify rare driver genes. PIVOT is a machine learning

application. It predicts cancer-causing genes using a variety of variables, including mutation and gene expression. These are known as driving genes. It aids in the development of personalised cancer treatment regimens. To begin, it employs supervised model learning (ML) techniques using known driver genes in the patient. The patient data and associated customised driver genes are unknown. Second, this tool employs models on several data kinds, taking into account expression data, mutation data, and the combination of all sorts of data. Genes are classified as tumour oncogenes, suppressor genes, or neutral genes using the PIVOT tool. It correctly predicted oncogenes as well as tumour suppressor genes like TP53 and PIK3CA. This technique can also predict novel cancer-related genes like PRKCA, SOX9, and PSMD4. PIVOT can identify cancer-causing genes in patients. This AI-powered technology will aid in the development of tailored cancer treatment regimens. PIVOT was created with the goal of predicting cancer-causing genes.

## THE GOVERNMENT HAS UNVEILED THE JUTE MARK INDIA (JMI) LOGO

The Indian government established certification of authenticity for jute items made in India. The Union Textile Secretary unveiled the "Jute Mark India" logo. This is an effort to safeguard and promote Indian jute goods. The Jute Mark India (JMI) will be a trademark for jute items made in India. This accreditation is anticipated to expand the local market as well as the export of Jute goods created in India to other nations. The Jute Mark India will include a unique QR code, which shoppers may scan to learn more about the goods. The National Jute Board, which operates under the Union Textile Ministry, is in charge of promoting jute and jute products in India. Between FY22 and FY26, Jute Mark India (JMI) was adopted as part of an ongoing plan for the development and promotion of jute. The national government invested a total of Rs. 485.58 crore in this project. Jute exports were valued Rs. 2740 crore in 2020-2021, while Jute diversified goods were worth Rs. 1261 crore. This accounted for 46% of the entire value of Jute Goods Exports. The preliminary export of Jute Goods in 2021-2022 was valued Rs. 3785.68 crores.





## R. PRAGGNANANDHAA TRIUMPHS AT THE PARACIN OPEN



**T**he Paracin Open 'A' chess tournament 2022 was won on Saturday by young Indian Grandmaster R Pragnanandhaa, who finished with 8 points after nine rounds. The 16-year-old finished with a score of 0.5 points higher than the competition. Alisher Suleymenov and India's AL Muthaiah, both of whom scored 7 points, were surpassed by Alexandr Predke, who finished in second place with 7.5 points. Due to a higher tie-break score, Suleymenov took third place. V Pranav, a young Indian

international master, lost to Predke in the decisive round and earned 6.5 points overall. Arjun Kalyan, an Indian GM, finished in seventh place with 6.5 points. Pragnanandhaa, who was destined for the Olympics, was in excellent form, winning his first six games before Predke held on for a draw in round seven. Then, in the eighth round, he defeated fellow countryman and GM Arjun Kalyan before concluding with a draw in the ninth and final round against Alisher Suleymenov (Kazakhstan). The young GM also defeated fellow Indian WGM Srija Seshadri, Lachezar Yordanov, Kazybek Nogerbek, Koustav Chatterjee, and Arystanbek Urazayev, among others (Kazakhstan). Pragnanandhaa, who had been seeded second in the competition after Predke, was on fire and quickly gained ground on the field before finishing half a point in front of a talented field. The young prodigy will compete for India's 'B' team in the 44th Chess Olympiad, which will take place close to Chennai from July 28.

## PU SINDHU DEFEATED WANG ZHI YI OF CHINA IN THE SINGAPORE OPEN FINAL

**P**V Sindhu, who has won two Olympic medals, defeated Wang Zhi Yi of China in the Singapore Open final on Sunday, winning her third championship of the year. Sindhu won the Singapore Open title, becoming the third Indian overall and the second Indian women's shuttler to do so. In the past, the titles for the women's and men's singles competitions have been won by Saina Nehwal (2010) and B Sai Praneeth (2017), respectively. This was Sindhu's first Super 500 championship of the year; she had previously won the Syed Modi International and Swiss Open, both Super 300 championships; it was a welcome addition to her brimming cabinet, which already contained two Olympic medals and a gold, two silver, and two bronze medal from the World Championships. This victory was Sindhu's 18th triumph overall. The 27-year-old will be leading the Indian charge at the Commonwealth Games, which starts on July 28 in Birmingham, and the title run will be a huge boost for her. The star Indian shuttler and former world champion put in an impressive performance, scoring 13 straight points to win the first game in just 12 minutes. However, Wang mounted a strong comeback and won the second game in just 18 minutes. In the crucial final match, Sindhu maintained her composure to win Kallang's first championship. "Getting this title means a lot, this would give me a lot of confidence, this will take me to another level. The whole week, a couple of matches were in three games, some were in two. But each match was important from the start. Now it's time to relax a bit and focus on the Commonwealth Games. This is just the start, but it'll give me a lot of confidence," Sindhu said after the win.



## PRANAVI URS DEFEATS SEHER ATWAL TO CAPTURE THE FOURTH WPGT CHAMPIONSHIP OF THE SEASON



**I**n the final round of the ninth Women's Pro Golf Tour leg at the Bangalore Golf Club, Pranavi Urs made four birdies in a span of five holes on the back nine to win the fourth championship of the year and increase her lead at the top of the Order of Merit. Pranavi shot 2-over 71 with four birdies against six bogeys and totalled 2-over 209, while Seher Atwal (71) with one birdie against two bogeys, aggregated 5-over 212. There were only two under-par rounds in the tournament, one

each by Pranavi and Seher, and the scoring and conditions were more difficult this week as none of the players finished with an under-par total. Pranavi overcame an early charge from Seher Atwal over the first 10 holes of the final round at the Par-69 Bangalore Golf Club course. Pranavi had a three-shot lead going into the final round. Pranavi took off as Seher faltered, outlasting her by three shots despite a bogey-bogey finish. Seher Atwal had a front-nine score of 2-over while Pranavi had a score of 3-over. This decreased the lead by one. Pranavi bogeyed the tenth hole once more, while Seher birdied it at two level with eight holes remaining after a two-shot swing. Then, between the 12th and 16th holes, Pranavi created four birdies while Seher only made . Pranavi was three strokes ahead as she started the day, but by the time she bogeyed the final two holes, Seher had dropped a shot, giving Pranavi the trophy and the winning check as well. The Prestige Golfshire will host the tenth leg of the WPG Tour from July 20-22 in Bangalore.

## NAVNEET SCORES TWICE AS INDIA DEFEATS JAPAN 3-1 TO FINISH NINTH AT THE WOMEN'S HOCKEY WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

**T**he Indian women's hockey team defeated Japan 3-1 on Wednesday to finish a disappointing ninth in the FIH World Cup thanks to two goals from Navneet Kaur. In the classification game, Navneet (30th, 45th minutes) scored two field goals, and Deep Grace Ekka (38th) scored once from a set piece. Yu Asai's goal for Japan in the 20th minute was the only one scored. India got off to a strong start in the second quarter and had a few chances within the first two minutes, but the Savita-led team was unable to score. Yu Asai's penalty corner conversion in the 20th minute gave Japan the advantage. India quickly received their first penalty corner but squandered the chance. They upped their intensity in the waning seconds of the second quarter, but Japan resolutely defended. Eight minutes into the second half, India won another penalty corner, and this time Ekka scored to give her team the lead. The Japanese goalkeeper Nakamura stopped Vandana's attempt on one occasion as the Indians launched attack after attack on the Japanese net. In the third quarter, India came within one goal of taking a two-goal lead, but Sharmila Devi's goal was disallowed because the ball struck her body. India completely controlled the third quarter as they drastically improved their performance to trouble the Japanese defence, which led to Navneet's second goal toward the end. The fourth and final quarter saw more of the same from India, with Vandana being denied once more by the Japanese goalie. In the waning minutes, Japan made a valiant effort but was unable to get past the staunch Indian defence.
